KEY STEPS

- ✓ Conduct a preliminary study
- ✓ Engagement with the community
- Household survey individual interview
- Community consultations with informal leaders or representative
- Provide for the community to receive assistance from the third parties
- Providing sufficient time to think and communicate amongst themselves
- Promote the mutual respect and no intimidation separate consultation meeting with Authorities
- Develop community mitigation / action plans



The project: Ethnic Groups, Minorities & Indigenous People

There are 3 ethnic groups in the direct Project	Khmer
area of influence:	Ноа
Khmer and Hoa are ethnic minority groups	Kinh

Khmer also recognized as **Indigenous People** in the Project fishing area as satisfying the criterias of IFC PS7

Communes / wards directly affected are a mix of the 3 ethnic groups; all except Ward 1 are **predominantly Khmer (64%-75%).**

Strong influence of Khmer ethnic culture in Project area.

Fishing / agriculture / aquaculture mostly done by Khmer families (but there are Hoa and Kinh fishing & farming families who will also be affected).



Preliminary Estimate of Number of Households Impacted by Ethnic Group

Figures for land particularly are subject to change but not expected to be orders of magnitude different

Ethnic Group	Estimated No. HHs Affected by Land	Estimated No. HHs Affected by Fishing	Total*
Khmer	131	126	257
Ноа	238	8	246
Kinh	66	27	93
Total*	435	161	596

* Total counts some families twice (e.g., impacted by both) so overall numbers could reduce

FISHING IMPACTS & MITIGATIONS





Map of Fishing Areas around the Project

- Around 1,100 ha required for offshore turbines and cable
- Fishing will be restricted in 'Zone 4' due to safety and security
- Currently offshore fishing involves nets to fish in direction of wind [between Zones 1-5]
- Only larger boats can go further offshore to avoid impacted area
- There may be some temporary impacts to use of canals during construction



Consultation process to date

- Individual and group-level consultations with 127 (out of approx. 134) fishing households (Khmer and Hoa)
- Potential compensation and livelihood restoration
 measures preliminarily identified with the
 Khmer/Hoa fishing families
- 3 Not yet consultation with Kinh HHs
- 4 Due to Covid-19, need to update with the Khmer/Hoa fishing families.
- 5 Not yet integrated with Vinh Chau agencies's plan







Fishing Development Plan

Developed with district/local authorities and the affected communes

Will follow National/Provincial/District procedure for offshore projects

Based on negotiations with PAPs on all key topics

Summarizes the results of all fishing impact and mitigation planning steps

Will be disclosed locally and by lenders

All interested stakeholders will have the opportunity to comment

Contents:

- a) Description of project and offshore requirements
- b) Administrative framework
- c) Summary of fishing/fisheries impacts
- d) Socio-economic baseline of affected communities and families
- e) Proposed mitigation and compensation measures
- f) Entitlements matrix
- g) Livelihood restoration program
- h) Monitoring, evaluation and reporting plan

The FDP will cover all affected communities/families (and IPP will have additional supports for Khmer communities)

Next Steps



SETTING UP WORKING GROUP









The Project will be consulting with the affected community and other stakeholders throughout the next phase. Key main tasks will be:

1. Set up Working Group(s) at District/Commune levels. Implement the Detailed Measurement Survey (DMS), Socio-Economic
 Survey (SES) & set the Cut-Off Date.

3. Establish grievance mechanism and pilot with communities.

 4. Analysis of potential impacts on land. Develop proposed compensation + other entitlements for land and other assets.

5. Further analysis of potential impacts on fishing. Develop proposed compensation + other entitlements for fishing impacts.

6. Develop proposed livelihood restoration measures and community benefits (for all affected groups including IP).

7. FPIC approach approved by community and implemented. Agreements signed.

8. Draft LALRP, FDP and IPP.
